Marriage License

**A Marriage License is only valid for three(3) months from the date of approval/purchase. They can be obtained from a Service BC location.

**Bring your Marriage License and Registration of Marriage form (partially completed) to your Rehearsal ceremony, as it MUST be reviewed by your Officiant and confirmed by the parties as being correct prior to the ceremony.

THE MARIAGE LICENSE AND BC VITAL Statistics REGISTRATION OF MARRIAGE Procedures

The provincial government issues marriage licenses as a means of meeting the federal statutes governing the freedom and qualification of individuals to marry. The following is a direct link to their website should you wish to reference:

There is an approx. \$100.00 fee associated with marriage licenses that can be accessed at any Service BC location.

At some time in the three months prior to your wedding date, you will need to buy a marriage license. Only one member of the couple is required to apply for a marriage license, but he or she must apply in person, and show primary identification for both parties.

A couple in possession of a valid British Columbia marriage license is legally able to be married anywhere in British Columbia regardless of where the license was issued.

Your marriage license tells your officiant that your wedding will meet legal compliance with all statues both Federal and Provincial. The Marriage License and Registration of Marriage form is presented to your Officiant partially completed. Some information is completed at the time the license is applied for, and then the officiant is responsible for confirming that the parties information is correct and for completing the balance of the form.

Marriage License (continued)

Before

All legal officiants, commissioners, religious or other, must be registered by the registrar general of the Vital Statistics Agency as a religious representative in the Province of BC, and that they are in possession of a valid Letter of Registration. My Certification number with Vital Stats is 44164.

The Officiant must ensure that before proceeding with the ceremony the legal preliminaries required by the Marriage Act have been fulfilled, namely that they have received from the parties to the marriage a valid British Columbia Marriage License and Registration of Marriage form authorizing the proposed marriage.

During the Ceremony

Both the parties and witnesses are required to sign both the Marriage Register (the Officiant maintains the register) and the Marriage License and Registration of Marriage form (obtained through Service BC)

Most often, the Marriage Register is signed during the Ceremony. The Officiant will maintain all signed ceremonial documents.

After

The provisions of the Vital Statistics Act designate the Officiant as the individual responsible for completing the Registration of Marriage. The Officiant must maintain the Marriage Register and forward the Marriage License and Registration of Marriage form to Vital Statistics for registration within two days of marriage. The Marriage Register is the property of Vital Statistics, but is maintained with the Officiant.

Vítal Statistics will send you a Certified Marriage Certificate upon receipt of your marriage filing.

Just getting you thinking....

- How many in your Wedding Party?
- How would you like your wedding party to enter? waiting at alter or walking in the brides maides?

Traditionally the Bride has been led in by her father; however, there are absolutely no rules on this. The bride could be escorted by no one, both parents, siblings, friends, their pet, a car, etc.

Processional Order

There are different ways to set up your processional order, below is just one example of a "traditional" order (walking in approx. 20 feet apart)

- -Groom to the Minister's left
- -Best Man
- -Grooms men
- -Bridesmaids standing on the Ministers right

- Children enter
- Maid of Honor
- -Bride and whoever is walking her in, enter after all bridal party is in place (traditionally, giver on the Brides right)

At this point the Groom could step forward to greet his Bride. The Bride will give her greeting to who has walked with her down the aisle, and the Groom could also acknowledges this person, hug / shake hands, etc. As an example, you could have the "giver" place the Brides hand into the Grooms hand to present her, and then he / she would then be seated.

Recessional Order - How you would like your party to leave

There are no rules here either, but a more Traditional Recessional Order is:

- Bride and Groom
- Maid of Honor & Best Man
- Children
- Grooms Men & Bridesmaids together
- Brides Parents
- Grooms Parents
- The Minister
- The guests

Ceremony Logistics

Signing of the Register

Traditionally, in the presence of your guests, the signing of the register is done at the end of the Vow and / or ring exchange and most often pronouncement, depending on what you decide.

**Ensure there is a Table or stand of some sort for Signing the Register & Table Cloth and cermonial pen if you wish. You can have one chair for the bride, two chairs for the couple, or no chairs. You decide.

You will need two witness's to the signing:

(traditionally, it is the two witness's that have stood up with you both during your ceremony.)

Ceremony Script & Vows

Regardless of the package you have chosen, I will begin to prepare your wedding script within three weeks of your wedding date, and even sooner.

My Standard Ceremony Package allows time for more personalized touches to your Script. I work closely with you (typically via email) on how you would like your Ceremony Script to be worded, and the feel of your Ceremony overall. I provide a draft script to begin, and we can edit from there. You could add lines of your favorite greeting card, a saying or pull from a memory you both share. I enjoy helping to make your script yours, and work with you on up to two hours of edits. (Which is normally an adequate amount of time.)

I have included various vow / Ring Exchange paragraphs and one line's on the next few pages that you can pull words / vows, I Do's from & mix and match them anyway you like. They could be used for Marriage vows, I' Do's and / or Ring exchange. From spiritual, traditional, modern, or some combination, OR completely create your own. Have fun with it!

A few things to consider on vows....

If you are totally confused about what to do about your vows, wedding script, I Do, Repeat after me, What?

Here are a couple of things to note:

There are no rules in what you do or how your ceremony script and vows unfold.

Often people choose to write their own personal vows, this can be in your own hand writing on a piece of paper, and could involve a more personal storey to the words. This could be in addition to vows that I would read and you decide if you would like them to be repeat after me, paragraph style "I DO's", or something different. As we begin to work on your script and your likes and dislikes of various styles, lines, and paragraphs unfold, we will just slowly begin to see your script build into yours.



I tend to veer away from editing couples personal "hand written or typed" vows, as I believe if someone chooses to express words from their heart, I always trust they know what he / she wants to say. My only suggestion would be to ensure when writing your own personal vows that you read them over several times for comfort and flow in how you wish to say them.

In instances where a couple would like to have personal vows, but aren't sure what to say, I can provide a base Vow script that can assist get you started.

Vows you select may be the same, or select different ones for you both. They could even be light and humorous.

They may be broken up any way you choose. All can be interchanged to use with a vow exchange, or to be said with a ring exchange or another ceremony you have chosen to include.

There are many various vows you could access online when searching "wedding vows".

**The BC Vital Statistics agency has a mandatory line or of similar context that the officiant must read during a marriage ceremony:

"In the presence of these witnesses, if anyone knows of a legal hindrance to this marriage, please make it known."


Rose Ceremony

A short Rose Exchange Ceremony between the couple could look like:

A single red rose carries with it the Universal meaning of "I love you". Your gift to each other for your wedding today has been your wedding rings - which shall always be an outward demonstration of your vows of love and respect; and a public showing of your commitment to each other.

You each hold a rose in your hand. Allow this rose to signify the purity and intimacy of the bond that you share. Let the exchange of roses be a symbol of the strength of your love and your commitment to each other even in times of doubt when words are

few.....



Unity Candle Ceremony

At the beginning of the wedding ceremony, a representative from each family (usually the mothers of the bride and groom) light the two taper candles. Later in the ceremony (usually after the formal vows), the bride and groom use the two taper candles to light the large pillar (unity) candle together. I would work with you on writing the additional Vows the way you like.







Unity Sand Ceremony

The "Blending of the Sands" ceremony can be a beautiful and meaningful alternative to the "Unity Candle" ceremony. (If outdoors) Like a Unity candle the pouring of two different colored sands together is used to symbolize the joining of the bride and groom or the joining of their families.





Mother Rose Ceremony

The Mother's Rose Ceremony is a great way of honoring the Bride & Groom's mothers or other family members during a wedding ceremony. The Rose or Flower ceremony allows the bride and groom a way for them to show gratitude for the love bestowed upon them and their mothers having given birth to them.



A short introduction and the roses are then presented to the Bride and Groom's mothers.

Hand fasting Ceremony (This is an example of other)

What is a Hand fasting Ceremony?



A Hand fasting ceremony is an ancient marriage ritual. Today, a hand fasting ceremony is a beautiful and unique way to represent your union and honor your heritage. A couple will bind their hands together during the wedding ceremony (before, during, or after reciting their vows), often to symbolize their connection and devotion to one another.

The ritual could take place at various points during the ceremony, before the rings are exchanged.




-There are so many different hand fasting vows and methods to facilitate. It would be open and up to you how it unfolds.

EVERYTHING is up for discussion with the wording of your script!



This star is a symbol of life. Each of the five elements: Earth, Air, Fire, Water and Spirit; Intertwined in a never-ending knot. That is all it is. And it is beautiful. A symbol of life, of existence, of infinite togetherness.

It is believed that the human soul shares a connection with all things divine. It is this infinite belief which assigned virtues to the cardinal directions; East, South, West and North and the celestial elements of Air, Fire, Water, and Earth. It is in this tradition that a blessing is offered in support of this ceremony.

Blessed be this union with the gifts of the East and Element of Air. Communication of the heart, mind, and body. Fresh beginnings with the rising of each Sun. The knowledge of the growth found in the sharing of silences.

rain; the all encompassing passion of the sea; the powerful force of the tides.



Blessed be this union with the gifts of the North and Element of Earth. A Firm foundation on which to build Fertility of the fields to enrich your lives; A stable home to which you may always return; a grounded strength to walk the plains.

Now that you have joined yourselves in matrimony, may you strive always to meet this commitment with the same spirit you now exhibit. We all bear witness to this ceremony you have just performed and you may now call yourselves by those old and respected names, husband and wife. Bless this union. You may kiss your bride.

All of these blessings emphasizes those things which will help you build a happy and successful union. Yet they are only tools. Tools which you must use together in order to create what you seek in this union. I invite you look into each others eyes.

I, (Groom), promise you, (Bride), that I will be your husband, From this day forward, To love and respect you, To support and to hold you, To make you laugh And to be there when you cry, To softly kiss you when you are hurting, And to be your companion and your friend, On this Magickal journey that we will now make together.

Now you will feel no rain, for each of you will be a shelter to the other. Now you will feel no cold, for each of you will be warmth to the other. Now there is no loneliness for you, for each of you will be companion to the other. Now you are two bodies, but there is only one life before you. May your days be good and long upon the earth!



Ceremonial Fees & Method of Payment

To request a booking, or begin discussion, please complete Reverend Danielle's Wedding Interview form at http://www.lifeforceenergy.net/ceremonies/weddings-services/

In order to schedule your ceremony, a deposit of \$120.00 is required via e-mail transfer or cash. Any remaining balance is due prior to your Rehearsal or upon final invoicing.

Upon booking, you will be given a unique Ceremony Planning Guide that will assist with all aspects of your special day, from start to finish, including vow selection, and other important details to consider.

Base Ceremony Package: \$120.00 includes: a Ceremony Planning Guide, preparing your ceremony script, 15 minute advance ceremony arrival, up to a 30 minute ceremony, and ceremonial administration and filing.

Standard Ceremony Package: \$240.00 includes: A Ceremony Planning Guide, 30 minute rehearsal, 30 minute advance ceremony arrival, a 30 minute ceremony, as well as working with you to personalize script writings for your ceremony. Writing and working with you on your ceremony script, writing your personal vows (if needed), and any other special ceremony writings, and details.

Also, please ask about my wedding programs that can be used as a wedding agenda and take home memento for your guests.

Additional Fees

Travel, Extra Time, & Mileage

All Ceremonies are subject to a one hour weekend travel fee of \$45.00, and \$30.00 per hour for week day ceremonies. Any additional travel or mileage will be determined at the time of booking.

Session, Rehearsal, & Ceremony time (over your Base or Standard package) is billed at a rate of \$65/hour. Billing can occur in 15-minute increments

When and if mileage is charged, it is at a rate of \$0.53/km Any Parking or ferry costs are additional
